



Private Tour for Six with lunch at the West Hartford Elizabeth Park Gardens Plus 3 Fabulous Rose Bushes

Opened to the public in 1897, the park and gardens were designed by Swiss-born land-scape architect Theodore Wirth in conjunction with the firm of Frederick Law Olmsted. Following the tour, have lunch at the Pond House Café, a top dining destination in Hartford. Elizabeth Park maintains as its centerpiece the country's oldest public rose garden.
