EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

It has been another action-packed year at Chore Service. Safety remains a priority with clients and staff. COVID safety training and protocols remain in effect, and personal protective equipment is supplied to all workers and clients in need. We applied for town funding through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), also called COVID-19 Stimulus Package Relief. We are grateful for those towns that provided funding to help reduce Chore's negative financial impact resulting from the pandemic. We are also thankful for those towns which are still considering our funding requests.

Like many businesses in our community, Chore was impacted by the labor shortage over the past fiscal year. Chore remains committed to providing a competitive wage and found it essential to increase wages to retain and attract workers. Bonuses were also provided to reward workers for hours worked and years of service. We are fortunate to have dedicated workers, with a few remaining committed to Chore for 15 years. Workers are the backbone of Chore and, without our caring team, many clients would not be able to remain safely and independently in their homes. The demand for service continues to grow and Chore continues to seek ways to attract additional workers and volunteers who would like to make a difference in the lives of seniors.

A trend worth noting is that over the past year, we have received more calls from family members who, as they return to their "pre-pandemic" lives, are anxious about their loved ones being alone. Many people are finding it necessary to return to work in an office environment and need to move back to their homes in another city or state. Family members are worried about loved ones who are alone and without family there to "have eyes on them." One out-of-town family member called Chore looking for someone to visit their parent who was being released from the hospital that day and needed groceries. Chore quickly found a worker who was able to deliver groceries and visit with the client, providing peace of mind to the client's family. Another concerned family member called looking for someone to "walk and talk" with his parents and Chore arranged for a worker to visit weekly. Without family nearby, many clients do not have anyone checking in on them and our workers may be the only person they see. Companionship is part of every service Chore provides and it is very comforting to family members to know that local, compassionate people have time for their loved ones when they cannot be there in person.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our donors, Board of Directors and staff for their continued commitment to our mission. You have made a tremendous difference in the lives of our most vulnerable community members. Your continued support remains essential as we begin another year of service to the community. Thank you for all that you do!





In April of 2010, Chore started a special Client Fund with a donation of \$3,000 for the purpose of paying for "special" expenses that clients might have. This fund is to pay for things such as groceries, snow removal, mowing of lawns, minor home repairs and household items that are not covered by any other resources.

Lawn mowing and snowplowing are quite expensive but necessary for safety. Snow and ice are certain this winter so there will be a need to help some clients who cannot afford to keep their driveways and walkways safe.

Because of the demand for these essential services, we need to continually raise additional dollars for the Client Fund. To make a designated contribution to the Client Fund, you can write "Chore Service Client Fund" in the memo of your check.

Chore would like to thank the Rhoades-Robinson Trust Fund for its \$15,000 grant. Chore is very grateful for this amazingly generous and continuous support. The mission of the Trust is to help non-profits assist residents of the Town of Sharon. This past fiscal year, two Sharon residents who work for Chore part-time provided 19 Sharon residents with 785 hours of service.

How does Chore Service Work?

Chore Service helps elderly and disabled residents of Canaan, Cornwall, Falls Village, Kent, Norfolk, Salisbury/Lakeville and Sharon with household chores, home maintenance, errands and, occasionally, transportation. The purpose of the program is to help people stay at home safely and independently. Chore Service also provides part-time employment and volunteer opportunities for local residents. Client contributions are supplemented by a federal grant as well as donations from towns, churches, charitable funds and individuals so that the program can remain affordable for our target population of fixed low-income families. We do not send bills and only ask the financial information required by our grant funding. Clients are provided with a suggested contribution scale and are asked to contribute what they can (if they can) back toward the service. Workers are paid the same rate regardless of the client's contribution.

Garden Party Plans for 2023

Garden Party plans are underway to celebrate our 31st year of service. Our 2023 annual event will be in the lovely gardens of Nancy Hengen and Henry Monaghan in Sharon. These gardens have both sunny and shady areas with a lovely view of southwestern hills beyond a Sharon Land Trust field. A perennial garden juts out in the grass, creating inner and outer lawn areas. The inner lawn is partially encircled by a shady garden, including rhododendrons, azaleas and hostas. An s-shaped hemlock hedge, fronted by an easy-care shrub and flower garden, delineates the outer lawn. Two small water gardens are joined by a rivulet and filled by a recirculating waterfall. Annual pots brighten a kitchen brick terrace and various other nooks.
